A session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria, in the district of Columbia the 7th day of October 1809: This Inventory and appraisement of the personal Estate of Edmund Mandeville deceased was returned by the Administrator, and ordered to be recorded

I Samuel Symonds of the Town of Alexandria, in the district of Columbia, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to say,

Item, It is my will and desire, and I do order, and direct, that all my just debts and funeral charges be fully satisfied and paid,

Item; I give unto my wife Jane during her widowhood all my estate, both real and personal; and in case that she marry again, then I do give and devise unto her during her natural life full compensation and satisfaction of dower in my estate, the lot dwelling house and improvements, whereon I now live upon Wolfe street and my house and kitchen furniture

Item I give and devise my Lot of Ground with the Brick dwelling house and other Improvements thereon, upon Royal Street unto my daughter Mary Ingle, during her natural life; and after her death, I give the same unto my grand daughter Eliza the daughter of Mary Ingle to her and the heirs of her body forever,

Item I give and devise my Lot of ground upon Royal Street, with the frame dwelling house and other Improvements upon it, also my lot of ground where I now live, after the death of my wife, with the frame Buildings and Improvements on it, unto James Symonds and his heirs but in case he die without issue lawfully begotten, then I give the said Lots of ground, buildings and Improvements unto Joseph Symonds his heirs and assigns forever,

Item, I give and devise my lot of ground upon Fairfax Street, with the brick house and improvements thereupon, unto Joseph Symonds and his heirs, but in case he shall die without issue of his body lawfully begotten, then I do give and devise the said lot of ground with the Improvements, unto,

James Symonds:-

Item; I give and devise the acre of ground I purchased of the Executors of Mordecai Lewis lying near where Robert Vincent lives unto James Symonds, and Joseph Symonds, their heirs and assigns forever to be equally divided between them, but in case either of them shall depart this life without issue of his body lawfully begotten; then I do give and devise the part of the one so dying, to the survivor, and to his heirs and assigns forever:-

Item; The personal property hereby devised to my wife during her natural life, I do hereby authorize and empower her to dispose of in such manner as she may think proper at her death:-

Item; I give and devise unto Samuel Symonds twenty dollars, to be paid him out of my estate after the death of my wife:-

Item; I constitute and appoint my said ^{Jane} ~~Wife~~ ^{Exec} ~~utors~~ of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made; declaring this and no other to be my ^{last} ~~last~~ will and testament. The Condition of the above obligation is such that if that if the above bound Jane Symonds, Executrix of the last Will and testament of Samuel Symonds deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and Credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Executrix, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her; and the same so made do exhibit unto the orphans Court for the County of Alexandria when thereto required by the said Court

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Court, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all
other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased
which at any time after shall come to the hands and posses-
sion of any other person or persons for him, do well and
truly administer, according to law; and further do make
a just and true account of all her actings and doings there-
in, when thereto required by the said Court; and also shall
well and truly pay and deliver, all the legacies contain-
