and perfect mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the same, do make this  
my last will & testament in manner and form following (that is to say) First I give  
and bequeath unto my beloved Sisters Elizabeth Richard and Phillipa Jeffries  
all my ready money that may remain on hand & after my funeral expenses are  
paid. It is also my will and desire that immediately after my decease my exec-  
tors (hereinafter named) settling stock in the Potowmack Bank on a bill of exchange  
thereon to be also committed to my sister Elizabeth Richard for the  
use of the said Elizabeth & Phillipa, but in case my sisters should be  
dead, it is then my desire that whatever is committed shall be equally divided  
among my surviving relations. Secondly, It is my will and desire that  
my house and house and lot upon Washington Street in the County of Dis-  
trict afores<sup>d</sup> shall in the course of next summer be sold and the money arising  
therefrom to be applied to the discharge of my just debts and the remainder  
to be also committed to my aforesaid Sisters or relations to be divided as before  
mentioned. Thirdly it is my will and desire that my worthy and beloved  
son & Eliza Lake shall inherit and possess all and singularly every part and  
parcel of my wearing apparel and every part and parcel of my house hold &  
Kitchen furniture. Item it is my last will and desire that my
