

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria
the 11th day of August 1802. Walter Stoddert, Administrator
came into Court and being upwards of fourteen years old,
chose John Wise for his guardian.

Know all Men by these presents that we John Wise and
Peter Ware, are held and firmly bound to George Gilpin Esquire
Judge of the Orphans Court of Alexandria County and his Successors
in office in the Sum of Six thousand Dollars, to the payment
whereof well and truly to be made, we Bind ourselves and
each of us for the whole and in the whole our and each of ours
Heirs, Executors and Administrators jointly and severally firm-
ly by these presents, Sealed with our Seals and dated this
Eleventh day of August 1802. The Condition of the
above obligation is such that if the above bound John Wise,
Guardian of Walter Stoddert, Alexander his Executors and Ad-
ministrators do and shall well and truly pay unto the said Orphans
all such Estates and Estates as now is or hereafter shall come
to the hands or possession of the said John Wise, as soon as the said
Orphan attains lawful age, or when thereto required by the said
Court, shall well and truly save harmless the said Judge and
his Successors from all trouble and Damage, that shall or
may arise about the said Estate then this obligation to be
void and of none effect else to remain in full force.
