 Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria
 in the District of Columbia, and his successors in office in the sum of
 two thousand dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the
 said Judge and his successors in office, we bind ourselves our Heirs Executors
 and Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed
 with our Seals and dated the second day of June 1810

The Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the said James
 Sanderson Administrator of the goods chattles and credits of William
 James Hall deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and
 singular the goods chattles and credits of the said deceased, which have
 or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Administrator
 or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him
 and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court, at such
 times as he shall be thereto required by the said Court, And the same
 goods chattles and credits do well and truly administer according to
 law, and make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein
 when therunto required by the said Court, and for her so well and
 truly pay and all the rest of the said goods chattles and credits which
 shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator, the
 same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court
 for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively
 as are entitled to the same by law, And if it shall hereafter appear
 that any last Will and testament was made by the deceased and the
 same be proved in Court and the executor obtain a Certificate of the
 probate thereof, and the said Administrator do in such case being re-
 quired under and deliver up his letters of Administration, Then this
 obligation to be void else to remain in full force
