In the Name of God Amen, I William Sudwell of Greenspring in the Commonwealth of Virginia, being of sound disposing sense and memory do make public and declare this instrument or written paper to be and to contain my last will and testament hereby revoking, annulling and rendering void to all intents and purposes all former Wills or testaments by me heretofore made -
First my soul I commit to our gracious God, and heavenly Father jointly and separately hoping that through his infinite mercy and the precious merits of our blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ it will enter into eternal salvation.
Next I desire that my body may be committed to the Earth without any unnecessary expence near the grave of my late dear & respected father in the Church yard at James Town. The spot where I wish to be interred is designated by two flags of Sycamore on the south side of the grave of my late father.
Next my will and desire is that a neat and appropriate Tomb stone may be placed over his grave and my own, and that the Church yard in which our remains are deposited with those of our Ancestors may be forthwith enclosed with a substantial brick wall at least two bricks thick and five feet high and a neat Iron gate to be placed at the entrance. Next my will and desire is that a plain Tablet be placed over the grave of Sillab Pax my late faithful house keeper in commemoration of his fidelity and integrity. To each of the sons of the said Sillab Pax, whose names I do not at present recollect, I give and bequeath the sum of two hundred Dollars to be paid to them by my Executors hereinafter named as soon as may be after my decease: in this bequest their attention is requested.
Next to my much respected and revered friend Doct^r James Madison Bishop of Virginia, I give and bequeath the whole of my library except the Family Bible at Greenspring and all the Books which I may have added or subscribed for, which his acceptance is requested. I also bequeath to him

Islam and gratitude. I then I give and bequeath to my friend Littleton Miller Jagerwell Esq^r my Chariot band the harness and my gig with the harness belonging thereto, also my two servel carriage horses -
I then I give and bequeath to my grandson William Coleman son of William and Elizabeth Coleman of Williams being the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars to be paid to him in gold or silver coin when he arrives to the age of twenty one year, and in the mean time the interest of the said sum is to be paid half yearly by my Executors hereinafter named to his father or guardian to be by them expended on his education. Next it is my will and desire that William Coleman Esq^r of Williamsburg be exonerated from every debt due or demand which from my books or papers may appear against him. I then I give and bequeath to my dear and esteemed friend Doct^r William Jagerwell three thousand five hundred dollars which I desire my Executors hereinafter named may pay to him within three months after my decease. Next my will and desire is that all my negro slaves may in the first day of January next be emancipated, that those who have arrived at the age of puberty and chose it may be allowed to settle on such part of my cultivated lands as my Executors may designate, where I wish comfortable houses to be built for them at the expence of my estate with a sufficiency of Indian corn to be allowed from the same for their support for one year and that they be allowed to have such furniture and settlements as they may prefer from any rent or charge whatever. I give to See a Blacksmith all the tools in my Blacksmiths shop with the use of the shop during his natural life. All those under the age of twenty one years, I request my Executors to remove to some one of the United States north of the Potomac where they may receive such an Education as may be suited to their several

capacities at the expense of my Estate by which I trust I may be enabled to acquire an honest and comfortable support -

Convinced of the importance of education and the advantages which may be derived from a general diffusion of useful information among the mass of society in governments depending for their support on popular opinion, and being desirous of affording some assistance towards the attainment of so desirable an end, I give devise and bequeath to the president, masters and professors of William and Mary College and their successors in office forever five hundred Winchester bushels of Indian corn which is to be paid them annually on the twenty-fifth day of December for the use and benefit of a Free school to be established in the Centre of James City County beyond being had to its present limits where the American language with the Elements of Mathematics and Geography are to be taught and such other branches of useful knowledge as a majority of the Scholars for the time being may think proper. - This institution is intended solely for the benefit of such persons whose indigent situations forbids their acquiring even the rudiments of an education - One thousand acres of the halwater tract of land is by my devise to stand pledged forever for the full and complete execution of this devise the bounds of which are to be designated by clear and obvious marks within twelve calendar months after my decease. I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint William Hodgson of the town of Alexandria in the district of Columbia, Silatons Waller Tagwell of the Borough of Norfolk, and my dearest sister Cornelia Lee, executors and administrators of this my last will and testament all written with my own hand -

Lastly all the rest and residue of my Estate whether real personal or mixed not heretofore in this instrument devised, I give devise and bequeath to my dear sisters Patsy Hodgson and Cornelia Lee to be equally divided between them and to the heirs of their bodies forever. In case either should depart this life without such heirs, then I devise and bequeath her portion or moiety to the survivor and her heirs as aforesaid - Should both of my dear sisters die without such heirs, then and in that case I give devise and bequeath the estate hereby devised to my said dear sisters to Henry Lee eldest son of General Henry Lee and his heirs forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto this fourteenth day of July in the year four thousand one thousand eight hundred and two, subscribed my name and affixed my seal -

An account of Quartership Sessions held for James City County 1st March
 1803. This will was produced in Court and Thompson, Silatons
 Waller and George Jackson being sworn deposed, that they are
 well acquainted with the hand writing of William Ludwell
 Lee and verily believe that the said will with the name William
 Ludwell Lee thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the Testator
 and a paper writing annexed to the said will purporting to be a codicil
 to the same being proved by the oaths of the witnesses thereto, the
 said will and Codicil were ordered to be recorded. And a
 Certificate for obtaining a probate thereof in due form was granted
 to William Hodgson one of the Executors therein named, he
 having made oath thereto and together with Cornelia Lee and William
 Coleman his snarling entered into and acknowledged their Bonds
 in the penalty of Fifty thousand pounds current money conditioned
 as the law directs. Liberty is reserved to Silatons Waller
 Tagwell and Cornelia Lee the executors and administrators in the
 said will also named to join in the probate thereof when they
