The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound William Weston administrator do herin with a copy of the will annexed of Lewis Weston deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said William Weston or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria return thereto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits and altogether the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which at any time after shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said William Weston or into the hands and possession of any other person do well and truly administer according to law; and further do make a just and true account of his doings and things therein when thereto required by the said Court; and also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said last will and testament as far as the said goods chattels and credits will therunto extend and the law shall charge then this obligation to be void and of none effect or else to remain in full force and virtue
