I Abel Jackson of Alleghany County, being in a low state of health, through of a sound mind and perfect memory, Contemplating on the uncertainty of Life, and the Certainty of Death, and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, utterly revoking all former wills made by me. In the first place I commend my self to God who first gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be interred in a Christian like decent manner, at the discretion of my Executors herein after mentioned. Item 1st. My Will is that so much of my personal Estate, shall be sold by my Executors, hereafter mentioned, as will pay off all my just debts & funeral charges. Item 2nd. My Will is that I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Jackson for the Love and affection I have for her all the remainder of my estate, which I do intend to be in my manner coming to me, both real and personal, to enable her to raise and educate my Children during her natural life, and at her death, to be sold both real and personal, and the money arising from the sale thereof, to be equally divided among my Children. And I do hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth Jackson, and my friend James L. Lockhart to be the Executors and Executor of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I Abel Jackson have to this my Will set my hand and seal this 20th day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & forty two.
