Anderson one Bond of fifty dollars on herself. Also all my Cooking utensils and all my Cupboards furniture, the next place I will to Henry T. Jackson one bond of seventy five dollars. I will to James A. Jackson and Sarah W. M. Nancy J. Jackson & Muldij & Jackson all my other property of every kind, to be equally divided between them all, I appoint Crawford Jackson as my Executor,

In witness whereof I have set my my hand and seal on 7th day of April 1844.

I desire and will shall be sold after my decease and the proceeds to be equally divided between all my children to wit: Polly Annan Elizabeth Smith, Leah Huddleston, John Bourgo and John B. Davis. Also I give and bequeath to my son David Bourgo ten dollars, if alive at the time of my decease, if not to be divided equally between the above named heirs. 4th I hereby constitute and appoint my son John Bourgo Executor of this my last will and testament.
