

Pursuant to an order of the County Court of Alleghany made at the August term 1879 directing that the acct of of James L Woodcock Adm'r D.D.R. with the execr annexed of John James dec' be referred to myself as Commissioner of the County of Alleghany for further statement and that report, be made through to Court.

I have met said Adm'r at Hincastled and have taken the foregoing acpts I find from a settlement of the acpts of said Adm'r made by myself & returned to the said Court of Alleghany that there was a Balance at the Date of that settlement in favour of the Estate of \$23,107<sup>72</sup>/<sub>100</sub> as will be seen reference being had to that settlement and I find that since that settlement there has come to the hands of the Adm'r arising from the rent of the Sweet Springs the further sum of \$1,570 making together the sum of \$24,677<sup>72</sup>/<sub>100</sub> as will appear from the debit side of the acct and I find that since the said settlement he has paid out to the creditors & legatees of testator the sum of \$4,331<sup>40</sup>/<sub>100</sub> as will appear from the Credit side of this acct leaving a Balance in favour of the Estate of \$20,346<sup>32</sup>/<sub>100</sub> from which sum I have taken a Commission of 6 per Cent on the amt which appears to have been disbursed by Adm'r up to the time of the first settlement (Adm'r informing me that the Court of Alleghany had allowed 6 per Cent on the Disbursements of that settlement) leaving a Balance in favour of the Estate of \$19,279<sup>84</sup>/<sub>100</sub> as appears on the foot of this acct.
