In the name of God, amen. I Charles Callaghan being of sound mind & disposing memory, do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament

As soon after my death as convenient, I desire my executor herein after named to make sale of all my personal property & collect all moneys due to my estate & after first paying my funeral expenses & just debts I desire that he shall distribute the residue to my legal heirs in such a way as to make them all equal.

That is to say, that all my heirs shall come into "kitch pots" & those who have had advancements made to them during my life time shall not receive anything more than the others, all shall be equal, with them.

Item 2nd

I desire that my lands be divided into three parts. That is to say, the mill-house, stable and garden to constitute one part. The old residence & all the land lying north of the creek to constitute another part. And the land lying next to Minn's with the field lying south of the Creek to constitute the third part.

If my heirs can agree among themselves as to the price of the land, I should prefer that some of them should buy the lands & let the proceeds of the sale be divided among them in the way that I have herein before directed my personal property to be distributed.

But if they cannot agree among themselves as to the sale & purchase, then I desire my executor herein after mentioned to make sale of the lands & distribute the proceeds as above directed.

Item 3rd

I have agreed to make a deed to James H. Boswell of a piece of Mountain land, lying adjacent to his lands, on condition that he would cover my house, a part of the work has been completed & when he completes the whole, if I shall not have made him a deed, I desire my executor to execute a deed to

him for it. -

4th I devise that Malinda Smith, who was formerly my slave, be permitted to live in the house she now lives in & have the benefit of the garden that she now has on my lands at the mouth of the Cove run during her life, provided she behaves herself & keeps an orderly house. But she will not be permitted to cut any wood on the side of either Creek, but may take fire wood from the Mountain side. -

5th I hereby constitute & appoint my friend Henry N. Robertson executor of this my last Will & Testament. -

A writing purporting to be the last Will & Testament of Charles Callaghan dec'd, was this presented to the Court. The said Will was read & the same is ordered to be recorded. And Rescued N. H. Robertson the executor named in the Will, coming into Court & declaring to take upon himself the burden of executor under the said Will; On motion, John C. Carpenter, together with Andrew Judge, George Stull, Samuel Dickson & James M. Rosewell his securities, entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of 7000 & conditioned as the law directs & is ordered to be recorded. And Rescued letters of administration with the Will annexed is granted the said John C. Carpenter in due form, upon the estate of the said Testator.

6th The name of God witness: I David G. Givens of the County of Alleghany & State of Virginia being of sound mind & disposing memory, do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament, utterly revoking all others by me made, in the manner & form following, to wit: -

Item In the first place I commend my soul to God who first gave it & my body to the earth from which it came to be interred in a Christian like manner, at the direction of my executor herein after mentioned, and after all my just debt are paid, I dispose of my estate in the manner following, to wit: -

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Nancy J. McCabe the sum of five (5) dollars

Item I give & bequeath to my ~~son~~ daughter Mary A. Gishman dec'dt. 1868, the sum of seven hundred (700) dollars when he arrives at the age of twenty one years without interest. Also I bequeath to Gishman the sum of one hundred (100) dollars when he arrives at the age of twenty one years without interest. -

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Isabella G. Carson the sum of one hundred (100) dollars. I give & bequeath to my son William Givens my entire plantation (the Givens as the North Plantation) and all of my lands & accounts & personal property of all kinds (except that given my daughter Araminta C. Givens in and after item) that I may die seized off. Subject to the above devise & those herein after devised to him, my son Adam Givens his heirs or assigns forever. -

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Araminta C. Givens the sum of four hundred (400) dollars to be paid to the said Araminta C. Givens after she arrives at the age of twenty one years, in installments annually of fifty (50) dollars until said amount of \$400. is paid, without interest. Also one half of my household & kitchen furniture. -

Item I give & bequeath to my son Andrew S. Givens the sum of two hundred & twenty five (225) dollars to be paid to him after he arrives at the age of twenty one years in six annual installments viz: Fifty six (56) dollars & twenty five cents yearly until paid, without interest. -

Item I desire that my wife Catherine Givens live the remaining portion of her natural life with my son Adam Givens, but should she otherwise desire, my Will is that she shall have her choice as the law directs.

I, Sebastian Hensbarger, of the County of Alleghany
 in the State of Virginia being far advanced in life, but
 of sound mind & disposing memory, deem this a fit and
 proper time to make this my last Will & Testament, as
 follows, to wit:

In the first place I will & direct my executor
 herein after named, to pay all my just debts duly
 authenticated and my funeral expenses.

In the second place I will and bequeath unto my
 daughter Elizabeth Hensbarger, all my real and personal
 estate, of every description which I may be possessed
 at my death to be enjoyed by her & her heirs forever.

But in consideration of the above desire to my
 said daughter Elizabeth Hensbarger, I will & direct
 that my said daughter Elizabeth do support and
 maintain my two unfortunate daughters Mary and
 Rachel, in the same manner as I have & shall do
 during my life, during their natural lives. And I
 further direct that the property hereby devised to my
 daughter Elizabeth be merged with the comfortable support
 & maintenance of my said daughter Mary and Rachel.

And I further direct that my said daughter Mary and Rachel
 be given to my son
 John Hensbarger, of full distributive share of my estate,
 therefore he is to have no portion of my estate.

Having now disposed of my estate as equitable
 as possible it only remains for me to appoint some
 suitable person to carry out the provisions of this my
 last Will & Testament, and to that end I hereby
 appoint my said daughter Elizabeth, Executor of this
 my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking and declaring
 null and void all other & former wills by me made.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my

 1845.
