was again produced to the Court and the same was proved by the
oath of Alexander Rayhull one of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and the same is ordered to be recorded. And on motion of
James Warren, the Executor therein named who made oath thereto
and together with Samuel Carpenter Lewis I Manu, Andrew
Damon & Christopher Damon his securities entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of \$2000. Conditioned, as
the law directs and is granted him for obtaining a probate
of said will in due form. And Harriet the widow of said
deceased having relinquished (in writing) her right to participate
in the Administration of said estate which writing in order to
be filed.

I Conrad, Judge of the County of Alleghany
and State of Virginia, being far advanced in life and feeling
in some degree, the decline of my health, but of sound mind
and disposing memory deem this a fair and proper time to make
this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and disclaiming
all and avoid all other or former wills by me heretofore made.

In the first place, I will and desire, after my deceased wife
be decently buried and ~~and~~ my funeral expenses together with all
my just debts paid, ~~authorizing~~ to be paid off and discharged
by my Executors herein afterwards named. In the second
place, I give and bequeath to my two sons Andrew Judge & Stephen
Judge, all my lands lying and being in the said County of
Alleghany on the River, and its waters to them and their
heirs forever. In consideration of the above bequest to my
said two sons Andrew & Stephen, I will and direct that they
pay within twelve months after my decease to my remaining
sons Alexander, Jacob, Whitham, Newton and Jeremiah Judge
the sum of One thousand dollars each, to them and their
heirs forever; which said sums of \$1000. each I regard as an

advance on their share of the real estate which I own, and I do hereby
give to my said two sons Andrew and Stephen, the liberty after
my decease of refusing or accepting the above bequest to them
and in the event of their refusal to accept the same pay the
legacies entailed on them, then I will and bequeath my
said lands to all my ~~also~~ named sons to be equally
divided between them. I will and bequeath to my
daughters Elizabeth and Martha the sum of one hundred
dollars each in cash also their bead, studs and clothing which they
now claim as their own. I give and bequeath to my
daughters Maria I Morion, Nancy Brady, Catharine Montague
Elizabeth Judge and Martha Judge, the Legacy devised to my
deceased wife, by the will of her father Jacob Piesinger dec'd
which will is duly recorded, in the Clerk's office of Alleghany
County provided, I do not collect and pay on the same to
them during my life. It is also my will and desire, and I
do hereby direct my executor to sell the residue of my personal
estate of every description, not herein before disposed of on a
credit of twelve months for the best price that can be obtained,
and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between all
my said sons and daughters herein before mentioned. I
also direct my Executors to give the other legacies now of

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the time and place of the sale of my personal property
in order that they may have an opportunity of purcha-
sing any of my slaves they may desire. And lastly I do
hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Andrew Judge
and Stephen Judge executors of this my last will
and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto
subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 26th day
of December 1828.
