W. Lemon's
Will

In the name of God Amen. I Conrad Lemon of the County of Alleghany and State Va do make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following, that is to say.
1st after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I will and bequeath to my wife Nancy Lemon, all my estate, real and personal, for, and during her natural life. And after her decease, I will and bequeath the same estate real & personal, to my sons George Washington Lemon, Joseph Lemon, William Hall Lemon, and James Young Lemon, upon the following conditions, that is to say, that Twelve Years after the decease of my wife Nancy, they pay over to the other legates of my estate (to be chosen after mentioned) the respective sums of money bequeathed to them, then in that event, I will and bequeath to the said George Washington Lemon, Joseph Lemon, William Hall Lemon & James Young Lemon, all my real and personal estate aforesaid, to be equally divided between them, and to enjoy the same for themselves and their heirs forever.

2nd. I will and bequeath to my son Addison Lemon the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars to be paid to him twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy, to be enjoyed by him the said years.
3rd. I will and bequeath to my son Jonathan Lemon the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars, to be paid to him twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy, to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever.
4th. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Brown, wife of William Brown the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars, to be paid to her twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy, to be enjoyed by her and her heirs forever.
5th. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Poyer the sum of twenty eight dollars and seventeen cents to be paid to her twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy to her and her heirs forever.
6th. I will and bequeath to my Son Maston Lemon one good Horse saddle and Bridle to be paid to him when he becomes twenty one years of age, to him and his heirs forever.
7th. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Caroline Poyer wife of John Poyer, the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars to be paid to her twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy, but nevertheless my will that Addison Lemon shall have the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars the year after the decease of said John Poyer and then the residue of said two hundred & fifty Dollars, is to be paid over to said Caroline Poyer to be enjoyed by her & her heirs forever.
8th. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Jane Peter wife of Jefferson Peter the sum of two hundred & fifty Dollars to be enjoyed by her and her heirs forever.
9th. I will and bequeath to my two single Daughters Agnes Lemon & Catharine E. Lemon the sum of two hundred & fifty dollars to each of them respectively to be paid to them twelve years after the decease of my wife Nancy, to be enjoyed by them and their heirs forever. It is furthermore my will & desire that they or either of them, shall have a home and residence in my mansion house and to have and to hold, all their furniture that they now have, or may hereafter acquire, and to enjoy all the privileges after the decease of myself, & the decease of my wife Nancy in the same way, and to the full extent, that they now enjoy, and these privileges, are to be continued to them, or either of them, up to the period of their marriages or the marriage of either of them or up to the period of their decease, or the decease of either of them.

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among any of the legatees of my will that each of the parties shall choose a referee and those referees thus chosen shall select a third referee, and the decisions of those three shall be final to all intents and purposes.
It is furthermore my desire that all my family shall continue their kind treatment towards my Brother George Lemon in the same way & manner as when I was living. And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons George Washington Lemon, Joseph Lemon & Helicon Hall Lemon Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other, or former Wills and Testaments, by me heretofore made.
