I David Glasburn decr. of the County of Botetown D. Glasburn and State of Virginia, being sick of body, but of sound Will Mind and Memory, and knowing that it is appointed Examined unto all men Once to die, do make this my last Will and Testament, first after my death, I do.

Firstly, I do give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Glasburn the Dwelling House I now live in, and the third part of all the Cleared Land, and the third of all the timbered land and her feather Bed, and her Choice of two Hacks Cows, and her Spinning Wheel, and the Corner of cupboard and one Table. Secondly, I do give and bequeath unto my Son Frederick Glasburn the Plantation, that it now live on to be his property forever, and two Work Houses, to stay on the place for the purpose of working the Farm, for my wife and son Frederick, and the Ploughs and Seams. Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my son David Glasburn, one dollar. Fourthly, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Quicksilver one dollar. Fifthly, I give and bequeath all the remaining part of my movable property, to be divided

himself, and I do reserve and bequeath out of the
above mentioned property, unto my Daughter Elizabeth
Glasburn and Mary Glasburn one feather bed, for
each of them, and I do ^{give and} bequeath unto my son Freder-
ick Glasburn an equal share of the Property, that is
to be divided as above mentioned, and I do ^{also} give
and bequeath unto my son Frederick Glasburn the
two young horse teams that grow in his name, and
one Rifle Gun, to be his property forever, and last of
all, I do constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth
Glasburn and son Frederick Glasburn Executors of
this my last will and Testament, In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty-
