In the name of God Amen: I John Fisk of the County of Monroe and State of Virginia being of perfectly sound mind and memory Examined do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament "taking all This will by me made at any time whatsoever. - First it is my will and desire that, after my death it is my will and desire that, after my death direction of my Executor. Secondly, it is my will and desire that all my just debt be paid. Thirdly, it is my will and desire that one of my estate be paid to my Two sons John and Henry Fisk, one dollar each and no more. Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my Negro woman Fanny immediately after my death her freedom, also I give to Fanny my Correll mare. Fifthly it is my will and desire that my Negro woman Fanny shall live her lifetime with my Executor as I intend to provide with him hereafter for her maintenance. Sixthly it is my will and desire that my Negro man Charles be sold after my death. If I do not see him before my death, and that the money arising from the sale be placed in the hands of my Executor for the maintenance of my Negro woman

of every sort now in my possession to be disposed of as he may think proper by him giving security to the Court for the maintenance of my Negro woman Fanny during her life time. Seventhly I will and appoint John Crow of the County of Alleghany my Executor of this my last will and testament. - Signed Sealed and delivered this 6th day of July 1825.
