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In the name of Almighty God. I David Lockhart of Alleghany County, and State of Virginia, do hereby make my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:— First. I give to my beloved wife Rachel Lockhart, all my lands and personal property, or so much thereof, as she may wish to receive, to be enjoyed by her during her natural life, and at her death, to be sold by my Executors herein after appointed, and the proceeds of such sale to be equally divided between my two sons James L. Lockhart and John Lockhart, and my three Daughters Elizabeth Jackson, Sarah Edgar and Mary Kinde, and their heirs, and the children and heirs of my son David Lockhart, and their heirs forever. Secondly. I give to my two sons James L. Lockhart and John Lockhart, and my three Daughters Elizabeth Jackson, wife of Abel Jackson, Sarah Edgar wife of Francis Edgar and Mary Kinde wife of James Kinde, and should either of my said Daughters die before their husbands then in that event, to their said husbands and their heirs forever all my lands according to a Survey and division of the same made by Joseph Leavitt Surveyor of Alleghany County, by Plats thereof, dated the 14th day of October, 1830, and my written agreement annexed thereto, dated the 9th day of

October 1830, which said plot and written agreement, are to be conclusive, as to the division between them, and as to the valuation therein made, for the benefit of my beloved wife Rachel Lockhart. Thirdly, In lieu of the next preceding Section of this my last Will and Testament, I give to the Children and heirs of my said son David Lockhart (now deceased), the sum of five hundred dollars, to be divided, and paid to them, and their heirs equally, by my Executor, as they severally arrive at the age of Twenty one years, or to their several Guardians, in the payment of said legacy of five hundred dollars. The several Notes which I now hold on my said son David Lockhart (now deceased), are to be used as far as they will go, without any interest, which said Notes are not to bear any interest at all, but the balance which will be required to make up the said sum of five hundred dollars is to bear interest, from and after the death date hereof, which my Executor is required to pay to the said Children, over and above the said sum of five hundred dollars, including the principal of said Notes without any interest.

make up and pay the said legacy of five hundred dollars in manner aforesaid, and my just debts and funeral expenses, I desire that such surplus as may remain shall be paid over to my wife Rachel Lockhart, and to be enjoyed by her during her natural life, and at her death to be divided in like manner with the slaves & personal property. Fifthly, Should my beloved wife Rachel think proper not to receive all my personal property then in that event, such portion as she does not receive, is to be sold, by my Executor, and the proceeds divided as before directed. Sixthly, and lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Sam Lockhart Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other or former Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made in which whereof I have heretofore set my hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one (1831)

I David Lockhart, make and ordain the following as a Codicil to my last Will and Testament. To wit: It is my will and desire, that my Negro Girl Slave named Charlotte, be free, and set at liberty, from and after the 31st day of August 1846, then being thirty seven years of age. Secondly, - It is my will and desire that Charlotte Child is mulattoe Boy born the 1st day of May 1833, and named James Williams be free and set at liberty, when he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years. Thirdly, Should said Charlotte, during her bondage have more Children, I will and desire that they be free, as they respectively arrive at the age of Twenty one years, nothing so much of this, my last Will and Testament, as this Codicil relates to or affects, shall be void, and I hereto set my hand, and seal this 15th day of August 1835.

I David Lockhart of Alleghany County, do make Constitute and ordain the following as a Second Codicil to this my last Will and Testament and former Codicil thereto. To wit: It is my will and desire that so soon after my decease as practicable, that my Executor hereinafter appointed, do him and privately, at such places, and to such persons as he may think best my negro Slave Charlotte, and her mulattoe boy James Williams, as follows To wit: Charlotte until the 31st day of August 1846, at which time she is to be set at liberty, and her mulattoe boy James Williams, until he arrives at the age of Twenty one years, at which time he is to be set at liberty, and out of the proceeds arising from the hire of said slaves, pay to Joseph Hammon the sum of \$100 dollars and the interest thereon, which I owe to him, and pay to the three younger Children of my son David Lockhart (now deceased) and who have

not received any part of the legacy mentioned in this my
last will and Testament, I appoint the sum of fifty dollars cash
and which said sum of fifty dollars cash, then paid to them
respectively is to be in full of the legacy mentioned in my
will aforesaid, and the balance of any, after paying all expenses
attending the hiring it to be divided between said slave Char-
lotte three mulatto children Jo mrs. James Williams, John
Lewis and Evaline Ann. as to give James Williams, thirty
dollars more than either of the others, and to be paid to them
as they arrive at the age of twenty one years respectively. I do
hereby constitute and appoint my friend Christopher Dawson
Executor of this my last will and Testament and Codicil thereto
annexed, hereby revoking so much of this my last will and
Testament and first Codicil thereto annexed, as the second
Codicil relates or changes. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 16th day of May 1848.

Further my will and desire that my said slave Charlotte
shall on the 31 day of August 1849 be liberated and set free by my
said Executor and shall no longer be in bondage. Heretofore making
so much of my last will and Testament and Codicils thereto
annexed as this Codicil or Supplement, relates to or changes.

Michael Britt of Alleghany County and State of Virginia being of Sound Mind and disposing memory, do make and publish, this my last will & Testament hereby revoking and making void, all former wills by me heretofore at any time made. — First — I will and bequeath to my wife Sarah Britt, during her natural life, all that part of my lands, embraced by the following bounds, — acres 30. mt. — Beginning at a Cedar on the point of a Ridge, S 36. W. to a double Hickory Sapling, by the corner of the road, 2 poles below the road, thence north to a Rock jutting over the water, Corner to same, S 28. poles, crossing the Creek, to a pine bark, an Elm a Sycamore and ash, N 70. E down and crossing the Creek twice to three white oaks, from one root, an Elm, 2 single white oaks, and a small Cedar, on the Creek, thence a straight line to a double Cedar, at the point of an Island. thence down the meanders of the Creek, to an Elm and Plum bark, thence to a Hickory, thence with the Creek, to 3 poles below the Boiling Spring. thence S 17. W. 32. poles, passing through the Boiling Spring to the beginning, to have and to hold, as her entire dower in my lands & State. —

Secondly. — I give and bequeath unto my son John Britt and his heirs, all that part of my lands, on the N. W. side of Potto Creek, below the following lines 30 mt. N 70. E crossing the Creek nearly with a fence to the out side line. thence with said out side line to the late Survey of 42 acres. thence with the out side line of said Entry to the Corner by Ross, which is a Corner to the land herein before given to my son John. thence with a line of the same, to the Corner by same land. thence with my several out side lines to the Beginning.
