In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Scott, of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia, being sick and weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous, to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say, 1st. I desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid out of the money on hand, of my estate after my decease. 2ndly I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Morris Scott my two Slaves Columbus and Milly for and during the term of her natural life, and if she should die leaving a Child or Children, or a descendant or descendants of such Child or Children living at the time of her death, then to such Child or Children their descendants, their heirs Exors, admors and assigns forever (the said Slave Milly to remain however with my Daughter in law Rachael C. Scott, and keep her Child Washington with her until my said Grand Daughter Elizabeth arrives at the age of Seventeen years. I also give to my said Grand Daughter Elizabeth One Bed & Bedding, one furniture

This will was for the same by a lawyer at the Alleghany County Court and I was bound to read it to the jury.

- Bedstead. One set of Silver Table Spoons, One pair of Salt Shovels, and One pair of Sugar Tongs.
- 3rdly I give to my Grand Daughter Rachael Rebecca Hamilton Scott, my two Slaves Newton and Susan, with the future increase of the female slave, for and during the Term of her natural life, then to such Child or Children or descendants of my said last mentioned Grand Daughter, as may be living at the time of her death, his her or their executors, Admors & assigns forever. I also give to my said last named Grand Daughter One Bed and Bedding and one Bureau.
- 4thly, I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Jane Hamilton Scott my two Slaves Sam and Washington, for and during the Term of her natural life, then to such Child or Children or descendants of my said last named Grand Daughter as may be living at the time of her death, his, her or their executors, Admors & assigns forever. I also give to my said last named Grand Daughter One Bed and Bedding.
- 5thly, I give my two Slaves, Joshua & William to my Grand Daughter Ann Smith Scott, for and during her natural life, then to such Child or Children or descendants of my said last named Grand Daughter, as may be living at the time of her death, his, her or their executors, Admors & assigns forever. I also give my said last named Grand Daughter my Silver Watch.
- 6thly, I give to my Daughter in Law, Rachael Scott, one Corner Cupboard and its furniture, one dining Table, one set of Chairs and one Stand.
- 7thly, I give to my Grand Daughter Mary Jane Hamilton Scott, two hundred Dollars.
- 8thly, I give to my Grand Daughter Ann Smith Scott, one hundred Dollars.
- 9thly, I desire that fifty dollars, out of my estate shall be appropriated in procuring and setting up a pair of Marble slate Stones for my son Andrew M Scotts Grave.
- 10thly, I give to the Presbyterian Church Session and their Successors in Office in Lexington two hundred dollars, to be put out on interest, and that interest to be applied annually in supporting a preacher, but in Case the said Church should at any time be destitute of a pastor, then the interest on said last mentioned sum of money shall go to increase the principal until such time as the Church is blessed with a pastor. — 11thly, I desire the above named servants to be hired and provided by my executor and

- and at the end of every year, until they are assigned to their proper owners. They are to receive one dollar in Cash a piece.
- 12thly, I desire that my lot of Books, so soon as the foregoing named Grand Children shall arrive at an age, to be Capable for taking Care of them, shall be equally divided between them with the Addition of a Morocco Bound Bible a piece.
- 13thly, I desire that out of my estate my four Grand Children, shall each be sent ~~two~~ five months before to School, to receive good Education at such time as their Mother with the advice of her friends may think advisable.
- 14thly, All the rest of my estate, both real and personal whether disposed of I desire may be equally divided among my four Grand Children herein before named. — and lastly I do hereby Constitute & appoint my friend Isaac Little Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other and former Wills by me heretofore made, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of February 1840.
