to my family, do make, ordain and publish this my Last Will
and Testament.

it came, to be interred in Christian & decent manner at
the direction of my executors hereafter mentioned.

ecutors as soon after my death as practicable.

II I will and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife
Catherine M. Scott for and during her natural life,
my plantation upon which I now reside, together
with all the live stock, grain, and other personal prop-
erty therein of every kind and description, except my
Chas in action, and if my wife finds it necessary
for her comfortable support and maintenance to sell
some of the stock or other personal property on the
place she can do so by being careful to take such
an amount as to leave

if she ascertain the surplus products of the farm inc-
adequate to a convenient payment of the Tax of the
place, including necessary repairs, my executors are
hereby authorized to pay said Tax out of any funds
that may be in their hands belonging to my Estate.
III. It is my will and desire that my Executors sell
out all of my Town property including the lots
between the Depot and Lexington, until such time
as they and my children or the survivors of them may
deem a judicious time to sell said property, at
which time they shall sell the same upon such
time and terms as may be deemed best by them
and the net proceeds of the rents and profits of
the said Town property and lots, together with the
