I Galbraith Kyle of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia, being only in tolerable health, of sound mind and disposing memory, Impressed with the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof Desirous of arranging my worldly matters and save trouble to my family, do make, ordain and publish this my Last Will and Testament.

In the first place I commend my soul unto God who first gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be interred in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned.

Secondly, After paying all of my just debts it is my will and desire that my wife Julia H. Kyle have the entire and sole management of all my real estate, house and all things that have belonged during her natural life, and that full power be hereunto in her to dispose of my real estate at any time that she think the interest of her children may think that she is getting such a price as will enable her to pay my just debts and the balance of the same to be paid to her in some more suitable manner than by the sale of the same.

Thirdly, I do hereby direct that my Executors pay to my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle the sum of (\$1000) & 00/100 Dollars, to be made out of my estate, to my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle when she is the wife of her only without interest until my son Thomas Haggis Kyle arrives at the age of twenty one years, and then to pay the said sum and the interest thereon to my son Thomas Haggis Kyle until and to my son Thomas Haggis Kyle all of my estate, both real and personal that has not otherwise been made use of, up to the death of his mother, to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly, I do hereby direct my son to be appointed guardian of the person of my daughter Elizabeth H. chairs in action, and if my wife finds it necessary

care as will be to best advantage for the same.

if she ascertain the surplus products of the farm in-
adequate to a convenient payment of the Tax of the
place, including necessary repairs, my Executors are
hereby authorized to pay said Tax out of any funds

III. It is my will and desire that my Executors sell
out all of my Town property including the lots
between the Depot and Lexington, until such time
