I George Carson of the County of Alleghany and State of
Virginia do make and publish this as and for my last Will
and Testament, hereby revoking and declaring null and void
all other Wills by me heretofore made, as follows. viz
My will and desire is that my farm be divided by Com-
missioners hereafter named into three parts as nearly equal in
value as can be and I give to my son John A. the upper
end of said farm on which he now resides. To my children
by my present wife I give that portion upon which my
dwelling house and other improvements stand and to my son
Henry P. I give the lower end of said farm. My will and
desire is that my wife shall have her support off of that
portion of the farm devised to her children while she
remains my widow but no longer. To my son John A.
I give my dun mare "Ann", and my new Saddle and
Bridle and require him to pay to my present wifes children
Fifty Dollars and Nineteen Dollars to my son Henry
P. This Amount of American Dollars to be paid to
Henry P. is intended as part payment of the sum of
Thirty Six Dollars which I owe him, of borrowed money.
I require him to pay to my present wifes children the sum
of Fifty Dollars deducting therefrom the sum of Nineteen
Dollars which amount of Nineteen Dollars is intended
to complete the payment of the Thirty six Dollars that I
borrowed from Henry. To my wife and her children I give
my dun Horse (Sam) and my dun Colt, "Eggs". To my
wife and her children and my son Henry P. I give 16
head of Hogs to be divided between them as they see proper.
To my wife and her children I give two pair plow gear.
To my sons Geo. A. and Henry P. I give my Threshing
Machine, Wagon and harness and all my farming utensils.
To my wife and her children and her son Henry P. I
give my sheep. To my wife and her children I give
two milk cows. To my son Henry P. I give one Cow
and calf. I desire that all my young cattle be sold
and the money divided equally between my wife and her
children and my sons John & Henry. To my son Henry
P. I give one bed & bedding. To my wife and her children

 to my wife and her Children I give all the grain and
 bacon that may be on hand at the time of my death.
 All my other property not hereinbefore named I give to my

 P. I appoint Wm. Dameron, Thomas Carlen and Henry
 C. Dameron Commissioners to divide my land into three
 tracts as hereinbefore directed. I hereby nominate & appoint
 my son Henry P. Carson Guardian for my infant children
 and as Executor of this my last Will and Testament
 In testimony whereof I George Carson have to this my last
 Will and Testament, set my hand and affixed my seal
 this 25th day of April A.D. eighteen hundred & seventy
 one.
