In the presence of my friends I have my last will and testament
 to be made, and knowing that it is appointed
 unto all men to die, I make this my last will and testament
 in the first place, I will and bequeath my soul to God who
 gave it, and my body to be buried a Christian like manner,
 and my worldly goods in the following manner, In the first
 place, I will to my wife Mary E. Master my entire estate, both
 real and personal, during her natural life time, and at her
 death, I will my estate to be equally divided between Joseph
 Jackson, John E. Green and William A. Munster. I will that
 during my wife's life time, that she is not to be held account-
 able for the natural and necessary wear of my estate or
 death of stock, caused by lapse of time - and all provision
 grain and meat is to be regarded as necessary for my
 wife's use and not to be accounted for at her death,
 and lastly I appoint my wife Mary E. Master as my
 executrix, and I do not require her to give bond and
 security for the administration of my estate.

4. To my Nephews (Children of Ann McChitic) I am and bequeath as follows: - to Nees, L. - one pair Mahoe, one yonder bed, (a pair of) a Mahoe, one pair of shoes, one pair of blankets (Home - spun). One white carpet & three hundred dollars arising from debts due me (when collected).

To Henry McClinton two hundred dollars as aforesaid.

To Arch^d. M. McClintic, one like sum of two hundred dollars & on like conditions.

To George T. McClinton a like sum of two hundred dollars; upon like conditions. —

Item 5, I will and bequeath to my niece Martha Carr oll, one hundred dollars when the same is collected from debts due me as aforesaid; -

" 6. I will and bequeath to my niece Catharine Daggs, Three hundred dollar (on the condition aforesaid),

" 7 To nephew Thomas Kyle, I give a like sum of three hundred dollars, on like conditions, (when collected)

" 8. I give to my sister Julia, one sett of silver Tea. — &
1 sett silver Table Spoons.

" 9. I give to my niece, Mrs. Caroline B. Hodgins - one
white snow drop, *Quercus*. -
