

I George Meyers of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing Will memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament (herely revoking all former wills - by me heretofore made) It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as soon as practicable out of any money I may have on hand at the time of my death (except my gold & silver coin which is herein after specifically devised) If the currency on hand is not sufficient to pay all the debts the balance is to be paid out of the personal property & I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Julia one third of my real estate to be held & enjoyed by her for and during her natural life and also the following money and personal property, to her and her heirs forever, to wit: All the gold and silver coin on hand at the time of my death - the mare and Colt Annamaly born in the family in her mare and Colt and one third of my personal property, except one wagon and harness, devised to my son George, but the devise to my wife is not to be included in any of my debts or other charges in which they are herein after devised to my daughters) My wife may if she take the property above devised to her, at its appraised value, or she may let it be sold with the other property, and take its value out of the proceeds of sale,

I give and bequeath to my three sons George W. Meyers, Scott L. and Henry A. All my real estate of every kind including that devised to wife after her death to be equally divided between them according to quality and quantity, to them and their heirs forever. I also give to my son George W. one of my wagons (he to take choice of them) and two set of gearings for the same a front and rear set) It is my will and desire that my Executor sell all my personal property of every kind and description not herein before devised to my wife and my son George, and the proceeds thereof, together with all debts due me and other shares in action, including the damages occasioned by the construction of the Covington & Ohio Rail Road through my lands, and any money that may be left from the payment of debts, shall constitute a fund to be divided between my six daughters

Jane Brown, Catharine Jones, Harriet Ann Meyers, Christina M. Ponce, Julia L. Meyers, and Emma M. Meyers. And they are all to be equal in the distribution of said fund, except Sarah Jane Brown and Catharine Jones, who are each to have twenty four dollars less than the others, because of small advancements made them.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son George W. Meyers, executor of this my last will and testament
