

Part of the plantation whereon I now reside
Beginning on the west side of the creek at the mouth
of the Tarkiln hollow and from thence down the
creek below the stable where he now lives and
thence a strait line down the back line on the
east side of the creek. From P line up the creek
my son James is to have. I do give to my son
James the one half of all my stock of horses
horns sheep and hogs &c to him forever.

Eightly I give and bequeath to my son
Samuel M Callister the lower part of the
plantation whereon I now reside from the
line above described which is to be the divi-
sion between my two sons, Samuel to have
all from P line down the creek to where
my land joins my neighbor's land. I do
also give to my son Samuel all my horses
sheep and hogs &c to him forever. - And I do
hereby constitute and appoint my son James
M Callister of this my last will and Testi-
ment. In Witness whereof I here by
acknowledge this same and affix my hand
and seal this 26th February 1822. in the
presence of

The tract of Land sold by me to White
containing one hundred and twenty acres;
and the other lying on the back River con-
taining one hundred, he sold for more than
will pay my just debts the balance is to be
applied to the finishing of the new house
that is yet unfinished. Witness my hand and seal
