In the name of God Amen. I Elizabeth Scott, of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia, being sick and weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous, to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say, 1st. I desire that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid out of the money on hand, of my estate after my decease. 2ndly. I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Morris Scott my two Slaves Columbus and Milly for and during the term of her natural life, and if she should die leaving a Child or Children, or a descendant or descendants of such Child or Children living at the time of her death, then to such Child or Children their descendants, their heirs Exors, admors and assigns forever (the said Slave Milly to remain however with my Daughter in law Rachael C. Scott, and keep her Child Washington with her until my said Grand Daughter Elizabeth arrives at the age of Seventeen years. I also give to my said Grand Daughter Elizabeth One Bed & Bedding, one furniture
