5<sup>th</sup> I ratify and Confirm unto my son Sampson Wolf all that I have heretofore given him.

6<sup>th</sup> I ratify and Confirm unto my son George W Wolf all that I have heretofore given him.

7<sup>th</sup> I bequeath and give unto my son Abraham Wolf my son's Chair, and I do hereby bequeath and give unto my son's

my Estate - 8<sup>th</sup> I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Elizabeth Wolf - or 300 dollars, to be paid out of my Estate.

9<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Phoebe Terry all my household and kitchen furniture of whatever it may consist of, Linen, Rob, and Iron &c. Beds, bedsteads, bed, Clothing & and a large Chest and Cupboard, also one Spermium Whirl, one Saddle, one dark Bay Colt (which is her own at this time) and one horse, and two Hogs - 10<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Jacob Osburn Terry one Axe, one Hox, one Hoe one drawing Knife. 11<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Joseph Terry, one Axe, one Hoe, one Hox, 1 Mattock. And the balance of my property is to be sold to pay my debts &c, and the residue to be equally divided between my 2 Grand Sons Jacob P Terry and Joseph Terry, heirs mentioned when they arrive at the age of Twenty one year.

And I constitute, I certify that my sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, in Witness whereof I the said Testatrix, have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand and seal this 28 day June 1837.
