By Quickel Henry Quickel of Alleghany County, do hereby make my last will and Testament, in manner and form following. That is to say

Examd 1st: I desire and will unto my beloved wife Peggy Quickel, the free use and enjoyment of the Land and Plantation whereon I now live, for the term of fifteen years from my decease, for the purpose of raising and keeping my Children together, and after the term above mentioned I desire that she my said wife, shall have free use and possession of only one third of the Land above mentioned, during her natural life, and I further give unto my beloved wife the following property

and dishes, and my young Bay Mare, and I further give unto my said wife for the use of my family, grain and meat enough, to do them, until the next crops be put for use.

2nd I desire that all the balance of my perishable property be immediately sold, after my decease, and, and I also will and desire that my Executor, sell my undivided interest in the Land estate of Ephraim Simmons decd. to the best advantage, and at my reasonable Credit, say from one to two years.

3rd I desire and will unto my beloved wife the one third part of the proceeds of the sale of the above mentioned interest of Land, and perishable property, after all my just debts is paid.

4th: I desire that the balance arising from the sale of the above named land and personal property, be equally divided between my five Children.

5th: I give to my son William M. his Executor and Adminr. all the Land on which I now live, after the term of fifteen years, to be to his benefit alone, except his mother's third during her natural life, then I desire that he shall have free and full use of all the Land on which I now live, to his use forever. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Dr. Pomeroy to be the

I Hyskiah Slaggs of the County of Pocahontas and State of Virginia, being sick and weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind & memory, inspired with the Certainty of death & the uncertainty of the time thereof and desirous of arranging my worldly matters, that I may diminish the Care of my last moments & save trouble to my family, do make & ordain & publish this as my last Will & Testament. — After paying all my just debts, it is my will that my wife & two Daughters viz. Catharine & Julia shall take possession of all my Slaves, and have the exclusive use of them during the life of my wife. 2^d I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anne M. Clarke the sum of five hundred dollars. 3^d To my Daughter Betsey Mapin a like sum of five hundred dollars. — 4th To my son George Washington Slaggs a like sum of five hundred dollars. — 5th The residue of my estate I give & bequeath subject to the preceding devise to my son Thomas William Slaggs

and my Daughters Catharine & Julia. It is my further will in case either of the aforesaid residuary devisees should die without marrying, that their portion shall pass to the survivor or survivors, or to be more explicit, if Thomas, Catharine or Julia should either die before marrying then the survivor or survivors to be entitled to their portion. In Witness of Which I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 1st day of July 1841.
