take possession of all my Slaves, and have the exclusive use of them
during the life of my wife. 2^d I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Anne M. Clarke the sum of five hundred dollars.
3^d To my Daughter Betsey Mapin a like sum of five
hundred dollars. — 4th To my son George Washington Slaggs
a like sum of five hundred dollars. —
5th The residue of my estate I give & bequeath subject
to the preceding devise, to my son Thomas H. Slaggs.

and my Daughters Catharine & Julia. It is my further will
in case either of the aforesaid residuary devisees should
die without marrying, that their portion shall pass to the
survivor or survivors, or to be more explicit, if Thomas,
Catharine or Julia should either die before marrying
then the survivor or survivors to be entitled to their portion.

Fourthly. It is my will and desire that the negro Girl, called to my wife, shall not be removed off the land which I have willed her, but there to remain until her life estate in said land shall end. And I do ratify and Confirm my said will in every thing except where the same is expressly revoked, to give validity to this Codicil.
