In the name of God Amen

I John Maslin of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia being Old and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with.

I Give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say 1st I Give that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of any money on hands of my estate after my decease if any and if none then out of the first money arising from any part of my personal estate. 2^{ndly} all the rest of my estate real and personal of every description I Give and bequeath to my alone wife Elizabeth to dispose of as she may think best.

3rd I desire that my Negro Woman Sally be humanely treated and comfortably provided for during her life.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint James Maslin Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other former wills by me heretofore made. I Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of July 1830
