1. I David A. Gilbert of the County of Alleghany in the State of Virginia, being of sound mind & disposing memory, and this day fit & proper time to make this my last Will and Testament hereby making & declaring said & null all other and former Wills by me made, In the first place I Will & direct My executor herein after named to sell all my real & personal estate of every description upon such terms and time as he in his discretion may deem best, to promote the interests of the estate (he selling my personal estate first) And out of the money arising from such sale of my real & personal estate, I desire My Executor, in the first place to pay my funeral expenses, & then all my just debts, duly authenticated. -

2nd I Will & direct My Executor, so soon as all the money arising from the sale my real & personal estate (after the payment of my debts as here directed) pay over to my three Daughters, Amanda, Malvina, - Nancy Euphonia, & Frederick Mildred, the sum of Twenty dollars each, or to their legally constituted guardians.

3rd The residue of the funds in My Executor's hands, of every description after the payment of debts & Legacies as above described I Will & bequeath to all my Children, or to the lawful heirs of those of my Children whom I may survive to be equally divided between them.

Having now disposed of all my earthly Affairs amongst my Children as equally as possible, I hereby constitute and appoint My friend Andrew Fudge Executor of this my last Will & Testament.
