I Andrew Shuman of the County of Alleghany and State of
 Virginia, do make and publish this, and for my last will
 and Testament, in manner and form following, viz:
 1st I will and devise to my wife Ann, that portion of my
 lands known as the "Home Place", lying East of Jackson
 River, together with the Mansion House and buildings appur-
 tenant, for and during her natural life, and her death
 to my Son Archibald and his heirs, by the said Archibald
 paying to my Son Thomas, within one year after the death
 of my wife, the sum of Two hundred dollars.
 2nd The residue of my lands known as the "Home place" lying
 West of Jackson River, I give and devise to my Son James C
 and his heirs, by the said James C paying to the Children
 of my Son George, or their Guardians, within two years after
 my death the sum of Two hundred dollars. This devise
 my Son James C. takes subject to the following rights of
 my wife and Son Archibald, to wit: The right of my wife
 during her life, and of my Son Archibald, to take wood, off
 the face of the Mountain (the East face of the Mountain &
 opposite the lands devised Archibald, for the support of the
 family of Archibald after her death.
 3rd I give & devise to my Son William (if living) the following
 lands to wit: The lands known as the Bottom Hollow, Cherry
 Mountain and a tract of 63 Acres in the Valley back of the
 Majors Lands. And if my Son William is not heard of within
 one year after my death, my Executors are hereby empowered
 to sell the said lands, and to divide equally the proceeds
 thereof among my Children. My Son George's Children taking
 the one share, that their father would, if living.
 4th I give & bequeath to my wife, all my House-hold
 & Kitchen Furniture, of every kind & description whatever.
 5th I give and bequeath to my wife, all my Slaves, for
 and during her natural life, and at her death, I give
 and bequeath my Servant Charles, to my Daughter
 Margaret, and my Servant Spencer to my Son
 Archibald, by the said Archibald, paying to my Son
 Samuel the sum of Three hundred dollars. And
 my old Slaves, I give & bequeath to my Sons Samuel
 and Archibald, in order that they (if living at the
 death of my wife) may be supported by said Sons
 who receive the "Home Place".
 6th The residue of my personal Estate, not herein
 disposed of, I give and bequeath to my Son Samuel
