But if the land above conveyed should from any cause prove of right, not to belong to me, then it is my will and desire, that each of my 3 sons together with my Grand son John Wesley Leason shall pay jointly to them ten dollars each. - 7thly. It is also my will and desire that my interest in a tract of land of 600 acres being 3 part or 200 acres lying in Alleghany County on Potomac Creek, and sold by a Decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Monroe County, and conveyed to me by Commr. Dunlap, as reference to said Decree

will more fully show, shall be sold by my executor and the proceeds arising therefrom, equally divided between my 3 sons and my Grand son John Wesley Leason. But if I should dispose of said interest in my lifetime in the said 600 acres tract, it is nevertheless my will & desire that it shall not in any wise interfere with the disposal of any of my property herein before bequeathed. -

8thly. All personal property belonging to me and not disposed of before my death, I likewise will & bequeath to my 3 sons and my Grand son John Wesley Leason. - 9thly. It is my wish and desire that if any of the above

Legatees should become defrauded with this my last will and testament and constitute any law author law side with a view to make void the same, that, that portion of my estate herein bequeathed to such Legatee or Legatees shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my Children, including John Wesley Leason, not parties to such suit. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son George Leason Executor of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other former wills by me heretofore made.
