Ino Seads I John Seads of Alleghany County, and State of Virginia
 will do hereby make my last Will and Testament, in manner and
 form following, that is to say:—

1st. After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I
 give to my Wife Barbara Seads one third part of my estate
 both real and personal, for and during the Term of her natural
 life, and after her decease, I give the same to my Children herein
 after mentioned, the Real Estate I give to my three Sons, William
 Seads, John Seads, and Cornelius Seads, each to have one

thirds share of the land that I give

my personal Estate to my three Daughters, Elizabeth Seads,
 Julia and Jane Dunahoo. Equally to be divided among them, and

to be enjoyed by them forever. — I also, I give to my son William

Seads the fifty One Acre tract that I bought of Samuel Porter

and thirty seven acres of land lying on the Bushy Run, the said

William Seads is to pay unto my son Joseph Seads, the sum of One

hundred and seventy One Dollars, (that is to say) fifty dollars ann-

ually after the decease of said Testator, one year. The above sum

of One hundred & seventy One dollars, being in Consideration of land

that said Joseph Seads was to have had, that my son William

Seads is to have, this being a mutual agreement between them.

2nd. I give to my son John Seads all the residue of my Real

estate in the Rich patch, to be enjoyed by him and his heirs forever.

3rd. I Give to my son Cornelius Seads all the Real estate owned

by me in the County of Monroe, to be enjoyed by him & his heirs forever.

With this provision, that should said land not be paid for during

my natural life, it is my Will, that it be leased or hired, until

paid for. — And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my

two sons William Seads and John Seads Executors of this my

last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other or former

Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In witness
