I wish them to raise all my business in this State also in Georgia to collect all money due me & to pay all Just Claims against me. I also wish James Kim to represent my interest in the land in the Georgia & Chi. R.R. as my appointee may be directed by either with what ever money I have due me to the benefit of my son Robert. I also wish Edward Miller to remove him to his own house and attend chiefly to his Education as I desire him well educated. It is my desire as James Kim is to represent my interest in the works that he shall receive two dollars and sixty two cents per day for his services from the concern. I acknowledge this to be my last will and testament.
