This my Olographical Will and Testament, is written while in infirm health, but in the possession of a sound mind, trusting the disposition of property acquired under the Decree of the Court of this District Court, made at New Orleans, 30th October 1835, will not give occasion for dispute. I have been seeking to serve. Said property consists of 1st. a Tract of Land 1836 Acres more or less in the Parish of Iberville, known as Forest Vale Plantation, together with the following, together with the following named slaves either employed thereon, or in possession of my Brother Thos. H. Beck viz: Sam.
