In the name of God. I Thomas M. Callister being
of sound mind and disposing memory do make this
my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former
wills and testaments by me made.

Imprimis - It is my will and desire that ^{my} body
after my death shall be decently buried and that
all my funeral expenses be paid by my Executors
hereafter named out of the Estate which shall be
committed to his hands for distribution.

2^d It is my will and desire that all my just
debts be paid by my Executors or some
particulars shall be paid by my Executors

into my wife Jane M. Callister one third part of my
whole estate real as used as personal to be by her enjoyed
during her natural life & at her death I bequeath the
same to my Daughter Mary Ann M. Callister to be her share
1st It is my will and desire & I bequeath accordingly
that the wife of my son William M. Callister shall
have the remainder of my land after my wife shall
have taken her third to hold to him and his heirs forever
with the exception of a tract of land called the Mountain
Spring which I wish my Executor to see & to distribute the
money arising thereof as I shall herein after direct.
5th It is my will and desire that the balance of the
personal estate of which I may die possessed shall be
see by my Executor and the money arising therefrom to
be distributed in the following manner Mary M. Callister

Smith each to have one fifth part & the remaining fifth
to be equally divided between the children of my deceased
Daughter Betty Smith. I also desire that the money
arising from the sale of the Mountain Spring be divided
amongst my said Daughter & grand children in the
same manner. I do hereby ordain constitute & appoint
my friend Hon. A. S. S. & Leonard Buzzard to act
as my Executors in ^{carrying} into effect the provisions
of this my last will and testament, I do witness thereof
I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 17th day
of May 1827.
