

I John Amitt of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia being sound mind and disposing memory, do make this my last Will & Testament. Solely avoking all wills, testifico made by me.

It is my Will & desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as may be consistent with the interval of my Estate.

I Will & bequeath to my son John M. Amitt, to him and his children forever, that portion of my real estate embraced by the following boundary, to wit; Beginning at an Elm, Buckeye & Locust below the Spring Corner to land owned by my son Michael. Thence up the middle of the Creek and with the line designated to my son Michael to Henry Myers' line. Thence with my outside lines to where a hickory formerly stood on the Creek near the mouth of the Mountain hollow. Thence up the middle of the Creek, to a large Cedar tree on the bank of the Creek, at the mouth of Hepler's Run. Thence up Hepler's Run to the turnpike & thence along the Turnpike to my outside line. Thence with my outside line, to John Bouyer's line. Thence with said Bouyer's line, crossing the Creek, to the Chestnut Oak corner. Thence up the track with Bouyer's fence to a White Oak corner, and thence up the Creek including all the Maggart place on the side of the Creek upon which my mansion house now stands, including my mills and distillery together with all the fixtures & appurtenances belonging to each and all of them. But the foregoing devise to my son John is charged with the maintenance of my wife Elizabeth, it being my wish that she shall live with her son John.

I Will & bequeath to my son Michael J. Amitt, to him and his children forever, that portion of my real estate embraced in the following boundary, to wit; Beginning at a double or forked Elm, at the mouth of the lane leading to Henry Myers'. Thence with the middle of the road leading to said Myers', to 3 White Oaks at the head of said lane. Thence along the opposite side of the old road, bearing to gullies to Henry Myers' line. Thence with Myers' line to the head of the Hazel bottom. Then to Jim's fort Mountain land, Thence with Mountain's line to the back line of land derived over by my father, and then from the double or forked Elm (the beginning corner aforesaid), to the middle of the Creek to an Elm, Buckeye & Locust below the big Spring opposite the Boiling Spring. Thence bearing the creek by the Boiling Spring & with the line of land derived over by my father to the middle of the river, near the Sulphur Cave, Thence with the line of

to Ammonants' line aforesaid.

I Will & bequeath to my daughter Lavia Catherine Blakes, to her and her children forever, that portion of my real estate embraced in the following boundary, to wit; Beginning at an Elm, Buckeye & Locust by the Spring Corner to land owned by my son Michael. Thence up the middle of the Creek and with the line designated to my son Michael to Henry Myers' line. Thence with my outside lines to where a hickory formerly stood on the Creek near the mouth of the Mountain hollow. Thence up the middle of the Creek, to a large Cedar tree on the bank of Hepler's Run. Bearing the Turnpike to the corner made for my son Michael. Thence with my outside lines, to the corner designated for my son Michael, and thence with his lines to the beginning, embracing all land between my sons John and Michael's land.

5th I Will and bequeath to my daughter Mary M. Carter, to her and her children forever, the following lands, to wit; My tract of land known as the Joseph Maggart Survey, one tract had known as the yellow root flat survey, one other tract of about 1140 acres adjoining Elkin's Knob, at the head of said log branch, and so on up the tract known as the west g. 1000 & so down to the east, was sold to George Bufford in the spring of 1859 for the sum of two thousand and fifty dollars to be paid in six years, with interest accruing from the day of sale, the first of which has yet been paid, but if the said Bufford pays for the land according to his agreement, my executors are hereby authorized to convey the same to him and pay over the purchase money to my daughter Mary M. Carter in view of the land, also my lot in the Town of Covington, Monroe and designated in the plan of said town as lot No. E.

6th I Will and bequeath to my daughter Franklin Easton's land to her and her children forever, all the lands on Ben's and Solomon's Run (not devolved to my son John) including the Bush place and adjoining lands.

7th I Will and bequeath to all my children jointly my interest in a Survey on Peters Mountain, known as the big rock survey to be held and enjoyed by them for range and timber.

It is my Will and desire that my wife Elizabeth shall live with her son John and have her support during her life, off the place above him. I also desire to her son and during her natural life by her Harry and Patty to be left after the place. I desire to have her keeps given all my beds & bedding (except two beds) their bedding for my bed, also my bed and all other articles pertaining thereto.

to take effect after the life estate given to my wife shall have ended.

10th I will and bequeath to my son Michael J. Smith my Negro boy named Bill, one good mitch Cow, a good feather bed and all necessary furniture therefor, My blacksmith tools of every description, and Tannin tools of every kind, including bark mill &c.

11th I give to my daughter Lucia Catherine Blaker Two Milch Cows

12th I give to my daughter Granville Emeline Carter my Negro boy Peter, to her and her children forever. I also hereby release all
Heirloom of this, her & herfore made her.

13th I give to my daughter Mary M. Carter, to her & her children
my negro boy Jack as a kindly safety donation of personal pro-
perty herfore made her.

14th It is my Will & desire that the balance of my personal prop-
erty of all kinds and descriptions, shall be sold by my
executor, and after the payment of debts funeral expenses &
Costs of administration the net proceeds thereof shall be equally
divided between my wife and all my children, my wife to have
a child's part.
