my Widow.

Fourth, I Will that the rents and profits  
of all my <sup>real</sup> Estate shall remain and belong  
to my beloved wife, during the time  
that she remains my Widow and at

the time of her death. In her intermarriage  
with any other person than the one and  
properly settled with her sample of the  
same shall accrue and belong to my  
beloved Daughter Elizabeth.

Fifth, I Will that at the death of my  
beloved wife Catharine or her widow  
that all of my personal goods and chattels  
shall be equally divided between my two  
children Elizabeth & William.

Sixth, I Will that my Executors after my  
decease do finish all my laws on my  
real Estate in order that the same may  
be settled or leased to advantage.

Seventh, I do hereby constitute and appoint  
my beloved wife Catharine Keen and her  
father Samuel Ripley of the County of Ripley  
Indiana one of that part of my Estate that  
lies in the State of Virginia, and Conrad  
Overlief of Versailles Ripley County Indiana  
Executor of that part of my Estate that lies  
in the State of Indiana.
