In the name of God, Amen. I Galbraith Kyle of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia, being only in tolerable health, of sound mind and disposing memory, Impressed with the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof Desirous of arranging my worldly matters and save trouble to my family, do make, ordain and publish this my Last Will and Testament.

In the first place I commend my soul unto God who first gave it, and my body to the earth from whence it came, to be interred in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned.

Secondly, After paying all of my just debts it is my will and desire that my wife Julia H. Kyle have the entire and sole management from all other persons, cattle, hogs and all things that have brought during her natural life, and that full power be hereunto in her to dispose of my real estate at any time that she think the interest of her children may think that she is getting such a price as will enable her to pay my just debts and the balance of her estate her son in some more suitable manner than she may see fit.

Thirdly, I do hereby direct that my Executors pay to my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle the sum of (\$1000) & 00/100 Dollars, to be made out of my estate, to my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle when she is the time of her only child, without credit my son Thomas H. Kyle arrives at the age of twenty one years.

Fourthly, I do hereby direct that my son Thomas H. Kyle have the entire and sole management of my real and personal estate, both real and personal that has not otherwise been made use of, up to the death of his mother, to him and his heirs forever.

Fifthly, I do hereby direct that my son Thomas H. Kyle be appointed guardian of my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle, and that he have the entire control of my daughter Elizabeth H. Kyle, as she may think best, in this my Last Will & Testament, written by myself and signed with my name and signature, written by myself and signed with my name and signature, in my own handwriting, and signed with my seal, this the 26th day of January, Eighteen Hundred and Seventy three, (1873)
