Pa. do make this my last Will and Testament.

It is my will that my Physicians bills and other
debts that may be against me shall be paid.

I Will and bequeath to my niece M. E. Judge, Daughter
of my Brother Andrew Judge my bed. My bed Clothing
Trunks including my Clothing or any other articles of that
kind, I wish to be divided among my surviving sisters as they
may agree. I Will to my sister Maria Morton one half
of my interest in my Marthas estate to be paid to her by the
Executor as soon as a settlement of said estate is effected.

The Residue of said interest, or half, I wish divided equally
between my other three surviving sisters viz. Nancy, Mary &
Elizabeth. I hereby appoint and constitute my Brother
Andrew Judge my Executor of this my last Will and
Testament. Given under my hand and seal this 18th
July 1837.

Alleghany County Court August Term 1837.

An Instrument of Writing, purporting to be the last Will
and Testament of Martha Judge dec'd. was this day produced
to the Court for probate, and was proved by the oath of George H.
Payne & William Savage subscribing witnesses thereto, and the
same is ordered to be recorded. Whereupon Andrew Judge the
Executor named in the said Will, here in Court refused
to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof in
favor of William & Morton, whereupon the said William & Morton
who made oath thereto, and with Andrew Judge & George H.
Payne his securities, entered into bond in the penalty of \$1000-
Conditioned as the law directs. Whereupon Letters of Adminis-
tration with the will aforesaid annexed is granted
the said William & Morton in due form.

In the name of God. Amen. I Henry Smith of the County of Alleghany
and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory,
do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
my all former Wills by me heretofore made.
First. It is my Will and desire that my body be decently buried, at
or near the Grove Church, and my Executors herein after named, are
hereby authorized to pay out of my personal estate, the sum of fifty
dollars to aid in enclosing a grave yard, at said Church, when a
sufficient sum shall be otherwise raised for that purpose, including
said Fifty Dollars.

Second. - It is my Will and desire that all my just debts
be paid by my Executors, as soon as practicable, after my decease.

Third. - I give and bequeath to my wife Fannie during her
natural life the plantation on which I now reside, to be bounded
by Mill Creek at its mouth, from thence to the brow of the Hill
on the east side of the Creek, so as to include the Carding House
Log Cabin, peach orchard and saw mill field (but no other
land east of the Creek, except the peach orchard and saw mill
field) together with all its appurtenances, except the mill and
Carding House. Also one half of the Hay raised on my Douglas
tract.

Fourth. - I give and bequeath to my son William, during his
her natural life, and the balance of my estate, except a survey of
33 acres on the Red Hill, are to be held and enjoyed by Andrew
William and Fannie his wife, during the natural life of my wife,
free from rent, except paying to my wife during her life, annually,
one half of the Hay as above directed. And after the death of my
wife the said Andrew William and Fannie his wife are to hold the
possession of and enjoy the use of all my lands (except said 33 acres), during
their natural lives, and after the death of each of them, I Will and
bequeath the same to my Nephew David Williamson, to him and his
heirs forever, upon his paying to his five sisters one hundred dollars each
month. I Will and bequeath to William Richie my survey of
land on the Red Hill, containing thirty three acres, to him and
his heirs forever.

Fifth. - I give and bequeath to my wife, for and during her
natural life, the following slaves to wit: Mary, Sally, Fannie, John
and Sandy. And all my slaves except those above named, I wish
kind and by my Executors, during the life of my wife, and then here
arising therefrom, to be annually, equally divided between my
wife and Andrew Williamson, to them and their heirs forever, and
I hereby give my Executors full power and authority, to use as many
in the management of my slaves, wishing as far as possible
comfort, either by promising them to Christendom for
freedom, or by promising them to Christendom for
