in the name of God Amen. I Mary Elizabeth Wolf
of Alleghany County and State of Virginia, being weak in
body, but of sound and disposing memory, (praised be God
for it), and considering the Certainty of Death and the uncertainty
of the time thereof, And to the end, I may be better prepa-
red to leave this World whenever it shall please God to call
me hence. do therefore make and declare this my last
Will and Testament, in manner following that is to say.
First - And principally I commend my soul into the hands
of Almighty God, my Creator, and as to my debts they are not
order which are to be paid out of my Estate.

2nd I ratify and Confirm unto my son John Wolf all
that I have heretofore given him.

3rd I ratify and Confirm to my son Isaac Wolf all
that I have heretofore given him.

4th I ratify and Confirm unto my daughter Catherine
Audus, all that I have heretofore given her.

5th I ratify and Confirm unto my son Sampson
Wolf all that I have heretofore given him.

6th I ratify and Confirm unto my son George W Wolf
all that I have heretofore given him.

7th I bequeath and give unto my son Abraham Wolf
my own Chair and Ten dollars to be paid out of

my Estate - 8th I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Elizabeth Wolf
- or Ten dollars, to be paid out of my Estate.

9th I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Phoebe Jerry all
my household and kitchen furniture of whatever it may consist
of, Linen, Rob, and Iron &c. Beds, bedsteads, bed, Clothing & and a
large Chest and Cupboard, also one Spermium Whistle, one Saddle,
one dark Bay Colt (which is her own at this time) and one horse,
and two Hops - 10th I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son
Jacob Osburn Jerry one Axe, one Hay, one Box one Drawing
Knife. 11th I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son
Joseph Jerry, one Axe, one Box, one Hay, 1 Maltick. And
the balance of my property is to be sold to pay my debts &c,
and the residue to be equally divided between my 2 Grand
Sons Jacob P Jerry and Joseph Jerry, heirs mentioned when
they arrive at the age of Twenty one year.

And I constitute, I certify that my sole Executor of this
my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said
Testatrix, have to this my last Will and Testament, set my
hand and seal this 28 day June 1837.
