and Negro Woman named Nancy to be raised between themselves
also I give unto my ^{well} beloved Daughter Franky Lane and small
Negro girl named Sam raising her life up she has a dear father but at
her death to go to rest and of rest it is to be given to William Lane and
Mary Rowe also I give all that I have in my hand to William Lane
Lane and Mary Rowe and Franky Lane except my children they
are to be equally raised between all my children and daughters in-
clude William Lane and Mary Rowe when I have been buried

And I recommend all and every other person to the same. This I give
and bequeath by me in my mind before named will and be-
quests and Executors by me in my mind before named will and
bequests Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament For Witness whereof I have hereunto set my my
hand and seal this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord
and right

 unto my three children to wit, Sophia C. Mason, William Sany Mason
 and Virgilio Todd Mason between them to be equally divided to them
 and their heirs forever. And in case of the death of either one or more
 of my said children without a lawful heir my will and desire is that
 the survivors or survivors shall possess and enjoy the part hereby bequeathed
 to the whole or children to enjoy. I appoint my friends John M.
 Mason, Reuben Saunders and John Timberlake, Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament hereby making and making this all other Will
 or Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness Whereof I have signed
 my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of May 1841.
