at any time made. First - I will and bequeath to
my wife Sarah Britt, during her natural life, all
that part of my lands, embraced by the following bound-
aries 30 acres. Beginning at a Cedar on the point of a
Ridge S. 36 W. to a double Hickory Sapling, by the corner of the

line, 3 poles below the road, thence N. E. 1/4 to a Rock putting over the water, corner to www.virginiapioneers.net
E 28 poles, Croping the Creek, to a pine bark, an Elm a
Sycamore and ash, S. 70 E down and Croping the Creek thro
to three white oaks, from one root, an Elm, 2 single white
oaks, and a small Cedar, on the Creek, thence a straight
line to a double Cedar, at the point of an Island. Thence down
the meanders of the Creek, to an Elm and Plum bush, thence
to a Hickory, thence with the Creek, to 3 poles below the
Boiling Spring. thence S. 17 W. 32 pts. passing through the Boiling
Spring to the beginning, to have and to hold, as her entire
power in my lands & estate.

Secondly - I give and bequeath unto my son John Britt
and his heirs, all that part of my lands, on the S. W. side,

and publish this my last will & Testament hereby ren-
dering and making void all former Wills by me hitherto
at any time made. First. I will and bequeath to
my wife Sarah Britt, during her natural life, all
that part of my lands embraced by the following bound-
aries to wit. Beginning at a Cedar on the point of a
ridge S. 36. W. to a double Hickory sapling, by the corner of the

line, 2 poles below the road, thence with Raghill line to
a Rock putting over the water, corner to said Raghill S. 36.
E 28 poles, Croping the Creek, to a Nine bark, an Elm a
Sycamore and ash, N. 70. E down and Croping the Creek thence
to three white oaks from one root, an Elm, 2 single white
oaks, and a small cedar, on the Creek, thence a straight
line to a double Cedar, at the point of an Island. thence down
the meanders of the Creek, to an Elm and planet Oak, thence
to a Hickory, thence with the Creek, to 3 poles below the
Boiling Spring. thence S. 17. W. 32. pole passing through the Boiling
Spring to the beginning, to have and to hold, as her entire
dower in my land and estate.

Secondly. I give and bequeath unto my son John Britt

cedar, on the bank of the Creek, corner to same. thence
a straight line with the said line, to a double Cedar at
the point of an Island, corner to same. N. 52. E cropping the Creek
nearly with a fence to the out side line. thence with said
out side line to the late Survey of 42 acres. thence with the

Britt died, has since been conveyed to them by Deed, therefore I bequeath them no land in this will. - Seventy. I also, bequeath to my wife Sarah my Negro Girl named Nancy and her future increase, to have and to hold during her natural life, also my Doom and its appurtenances, I desire my wife to have, to her and her heirs forever, also one set of Cloathing to her and her heirs forever. -

Seventy-first. I also give and bequeath to my son John Britt, my Negro Woman named Betty (commonly called Sally) and her future increase, to him and his heirs forever. -

Eighty. I also give and bequeath unto my Daughter Katherine who intermarried with Jacob Ammontrout, my negro Boy named James, to her and her heirs forever. -

Ninety. I also give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth who intermarried with Henry Myers, my Negro Girl named Nancy and her future increase, also my Negro Boy named Lewis to her and her heirs forever. - I also give and bequeath unto Henry Myers my saw Mill Evans including Saw &c, for which he is to

to Cut the front side of the House, to Shut the back of the Kitchen
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and to neither board the shed of the Barn, such plank as will be suitable for such purpose. - Ninety-first. It is my will and desire that George Britt's Widow have my Black Smith's Tools during the minority of my Grand Son Michael Britt, and when said Michael shall attain to the age of 21 years to go to him and his heirs forever. - Eleventh. I will and desire that my Executors, herein after named, shall immediately after my death, cause the balance of my personal property, mentioned before despatched to be appraised and sold in the usual way, and out of the proceeds, shall pay all my just debts & funeral expenses. - Twelfth. I will and desire that the balance of the proceeds of the sale of my personal property as aforesaid, shall be divided as follows. To wit. One third part theng to my wife Sarah, the balance to be equally divided between my son John Britt, my Daughters Katherine Ammontrout and Elizabeth Myers, to them and their heirs forever. I hereby ordain, constitute and appoint Geo. Pussey and Andrew Leaman Executors of the my last will and testament. In witness whereof I Michael Britt have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of March 1840.

Whereas I Michael Britt of the County of Allegany, have by my last Will and Testament, the 20th day of March 1840, disposed of my estate, both real and personal. Now I the said Michael Britt, being desirous of making some slight alterations, in some of the Legacies heretofore bequeathed, do therefore make this present writing, which I will and direct to be annexed as a Codicil to my said Will, and taken as part thereof. -

In Will and desire that the lines dividing land heretofore milled to my son John, and my Daughter Katherine, be so changed that the line will commence where a straight line running N. 38. W from a double Chestnut Oak, Service Bush and small Cherry, on the point of a Ridge, would cross the line of the land between the two lines with the corners N. 38. W to White oaks, on a Ridge by a path. Thence with the ridge S. 75. W. 50 E white oaks, on the same. Thence N. 55. W to three white oaks, on the Ridge. Thence N. 15. E up the Ridge to 2 white oaks. Thence N. 63. W to a black oak, Chestnut Oak and white oak; on a high point. Thence a S. W. course with the main top of the ridge to the out side line, and that my so John shall have the land below the line thus designated and adjoining the land formerly milled him, and that my Daughter Katherine have the balance of the land that was before milled to her, which lay above the above described lines, in consideration of which the said Ammontrout is build a good and sufficient fence on the line between him and my wife - 2nd. It is my will and desire, that after the death of my wife Sarah, the land accrued to her, shall be divided, by a line running from the white oak, corner, on the Creek, at the head of the Hoppel Bottom N. 24. W. up the point of the ridge to 2 pines a white oak and Chestnut oak. Thence with the top of the ridge, to a double Chestnut oak, Service bush and small Cherry. Thence N. 38. W to the corner designated as the division corner between John Britt and Katherine Ammontrout - all the land below the line thus designated, I give and bequeath

all the lands above the line designated as aforesaid, I give
and bequeath to my daughter Katherine Brewerton, to
her and her heirs forever which bequests are to take effect
so soon as the life estate which I have given my wife, shall
end. Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my son George Arby
heirs that part of a Survey of 300 acres which I had formerly
given my son Tom, and described as lying between a line to be
run from a corner near the house of Sam. Sanders, to a corner
near Rose's. Hence to the lines of that part of said Survey which I
sold Joseph Mafford, to include the boundary between the line
and the land sold said Mafford, to them and their heirs forever.
Fourthly. It is my will and desire that the negro boy, named to
my wife, shall not be removed off the land which I have allotted
her, but there to remain until his life estate in said boy shall
end. And I do ratify and confirm my said will in every thing
except where the same is especially recited, to give validity
to this Codicil. In witness whereof, I the said Michael Arby, have
to this Codicil set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day
of March 1842.
