 hundred dollars when the same is collected from debts
 due me as aforesaid: -
 " 6. I will and bequeath to my niece Catharine Dagg, three
 hundred dollars (on the conditions aforesaid).
 " 7. To nephew Thomas Kyle, I give a like sum of three
 hundred dollars, on like conditions, (when collected).
 " 8. I give to my sister Julia, one set of silver tea. - &
 1 set silver Table Spoons.
 " 9. I give to my niece, Mr. Caroline D. Hodgins - one
 white snow drop Quinquina. -
 " 10. To my sister Julia Kyle: I give & bequeath 2 year
 and filling for four Cattle: - & to my brother Thomas
 J. the same, which is now ready for mowing and

Item 11. To my sister Elizabeth I give one new Quinquina (white)
 & to her son M. H. I give one new Quinquina -
 " 12. The residue of my estate of whatever kind or description, I

 now stands, containing 120 acres, also another tract of land

 Commonwealth of Virginia, making in the aggregate three hundred

But if she should again marry, or in the of her death it is my will and desire that the same shall be sold by Executor hereafter named, and the money arising from such sale divided amongst my Children as I shall hereinafter direct.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Style (Now deceased) now aged 16 years, her share of my Estate, having previously given her about \$1000. in money and other property, which came through my wife and the mother of the said Elizabeth Style, which sum I regard as a full and equitable distribution share of my Estate. —

I give and bequeath to the Children of my deceased son Charles Mann, late of the State of Missouri, the sum of One hundred dollars out of my Estate, to be equally divided between them having previously given my said son about \$1000. — in Cash, which I regard as an equitable distribution share of my Estate.

It is my will and desire that my Executors hereafter named, shall, as soon as may be practicable, after my death, sell all the residue of my estate, both real and personal, of every description not heretofore disposed of or as soon thereafter as in their discretion, the same can be sold for a fair price, and the proceeds of the sale thereof together with all money, Bonds and accounts which I may die possessed of, I desire to be equally divided amongst my Ten Children, to wit; William A. Mann, Sarah A. Mann, Maryetta R. McClintic, Susan M. Mann, Eliza V. Mann, Thomas A. Mann, Francis C. Mann, Robert S. Mann, James M. Mann and Alice C. Mann, And Thomas Alexander McClintic, the Grand father of my son William A. Mann (above named) has given him a negro boy (whom I consider) worth 300 \$ It is my will and desire that he shall receive out of the proceeds of the sale of real and personal estate, last above mentioned three hundred dollars less than either of his brother and sister last above mentioned as it is my wish to make, all my Children equal in the distribution of my estate, —

It is my will and desire, that in case my said son Charles Mann (above named) should die before he has attained to the age of 21 years, that all the property

to be sold by my Executors, and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided amongst my Ten Children last above mentioned & —
