feather Bed and furniture, now used and occupied by my
daughter, Deborah Boyd (out out of the proceeds of such
sale, pay my funeral expenses, the costs of administration,
and all my just debts, except a debt due my son
William, for the purchase of his interest in the landed
estate of James Heimbach Sr. decd, and such interest
as the sd. William may have in his brother George's estate,
which I desire shall be paid out of another fund herein
after set apart for that purpose, and the surplus arising
from the sale of my personal estate aforesaid, I desire shall
be equally divided between my daughter Eliza Ann Rose
my daughter Mary Fennell and my son William.
The interest hereby devised to my daughter Eliza Ann &
Mary, I desire shall be theirs, exclusive of any Control
of their husbands, and as Mr. Manner to be paid for the
debt of their said husbands. And the interest hereby devised
to my son William, is to be laid out by him in the
purchase of land, as it will be out of my power to
devise any land without depriving my poor helpless
daughters of a maintenance, which I desire to give them.
The feather Bed and furniture above reserved, I will and
bequeath to my daughter Deborah Boyd, to her and her heirs
forever. - It is my will and desire that my boy, Roger, be
sold by my executors, and out of the proceeds of the sale of said

to my daughter Mary Fennell, for her natural life, my
share of the sd. Slaves; and at the death of the said Mary

& Julia together with the ^{future} increase of the sd. Slaves, be sold
and the money arising from such sale, be equally divided
amongst the Children of the sd. Mary, to be paid over to
them as they respectively attain to lawful age; until which
time it is my wish and desire, that their respective shares
shall be put to interest by their legal Guardians. -
I will and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Ann Rose, du
ring her natural life, all my landed estate, on the west side
of Falls - that is on the side of the Creek upon which
my present mansion is situated, also a survey of 50 acres
in Hayes Gap, then and also my entire interest in and to
the lot that was assigned to my son George, on the east
side of the Creek, and at the death of my said daughter
Eliza Ann, it is my will & desire, that the real estate herein
before devised to her, shall be held and enjoyed by the Children
and heirs of the body of the said Eliza Ann, as Tenants in Com
mon without the right of partition. In Consideration of this

 my Slaves, who are now living.

 Andrew Bauman Executors of this my last will and
 Testament, in Testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand
 and affix my seal to this my last will & Testament
 written on three pages of this sheet - this 20-day of
 June 1848.
