 produced in Court for probate and was proved
 by the Oaths of Susan Brown and Charles
 Brown subscribing witnesses thereto and the
 same is ordered to be recorded and an
 appeal is prayed in the case by Jacob Wolf which is
 granted to him upon his giving Bond and Security
 as the law directs. Whereupon on motion of Abraham
 Wolf one of the Executors named in said will the
 Executorship of the testator is granted to him
 and he together with Charles Brown Michael
 Maxwell Senr Peter Pence and Jeng Lerman
 his securities entered into and acknowledged their
 Bond in the penalty of \$1000. payable to the
 Justices now sitting and conditioned as the
 Law directs and the said A. Wolf took the oath
 prescribed by Law & Letters Testamentary are granted
