I Peter Harmon of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and testament in mass and form following that is to say. 1st I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease and out of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, there- in the perishable part of my estate being sufficient for the above purposes. Then I desire that my executors hereafter named may sell my land or as much of it as will pay all my just debts as shall remain unpaid out of the said part of the perishable part of my estate. 2nd After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give to my wife Mary Harmon one third part of my estate both real and personal for and during the term of her natural life and after her decease I give the same to my sons as hereafter mentioned equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed forever. 3rd I give to my son Thomas Harmon one fourth part of my plantation that I live upon lying on Snake Run, and in Alleghany County to him and his heirs forever. 4th I give to my son George W. Harmon one fourth part of my farm lying on Snake Run to him and his heirs forever. 5th I give to my son Shellen R. Harmon the one fourth part of the farm lying on Snake Run to him and his heirs forever. 6th I desire that the above named Thomas Harmon George W. Harmon and Shellen R. Harmon do pay to my son son James A. Harmon eight dollars and 30 cents cash in twelve months after my death to be his for ever. I desire also that my son son Andrew Harmon have out of the monies of my estate one dollar. 7th I give to all the rest of my Children each one dollar apiece as follows I give my daughter Elizabeth Lewis and her heirs one dollar and Jane Ribert and her heirs one dollar and to Mary Westmore her heirs one dollar and to Mary Hancock and her husband Nicholas Hancock one dollar. 8th All the rest of my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind it may be not here in mentioned or disposed of I desire that it be equally divided amongst my three sons Thomas Harmon George W. Harmon and Shellen R. Harmon, which I give to them their children their executors administrators and assigns forever. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Thomas Harmon Thomas O. Smith executors of this my last will and testament hereby
