And I, Joseph Ennis of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia being of sound mind, but of feeble health, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby, revoking all former ones by me made, at any previous time, -

1st I do not and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, by my son Joseph Ennis, to whom I thus give & bequeath the following real estate (to wit) The Tract of land on which I now reside, Containing two hundred acres, also one other tract containing one hundred and eighty eight acres, adjoining the above mentioned tract of 200 acres; I also give to my son Joseph, all my stock and farming utensils of every description, together with all my household furniture and other personal estate, with the exception of that which shall be herein after otherwise disposed of -

2nd I will to my daughter Sally James after her marriage a bed and Cow, and also to my daughter Matilda James by the same; And it is likewise my Will and desire that my son Joseph Ennis, shall give to each of my other two single Daughters, Nancy & Martha, a bed and Cow, in order to place them equal with my two married Daughters - It is also my Will and desire, that my two daughters, Nancy & Martha shall if they think proper, live with my son Joseph, free from any charge for boarding, whilst they remain single, they rendering such services to the family as has been their custom heretofore. -

3rd I will and desire that my interest in and to the Tract of land known as the Hazletts Tract, Containing one hundred and sixty Acres, or upwards, shall be valued by three disinterested free holders of this County, and by them a fair Valuation thereon placed by them, payable at one, two, three and four years Credit, after which my son Joseph Ennis, shall if he desires, keep the land at such expense -

ment, paying the first instalment to my daughter James, the 2nd to my daughter Jemmy, 3rd to my daughter Nancy and the 4th and last to my daughter Martha, as they may become due; but if my son Joseph should not

proper to keep the land above described at said valuation than it is my will and desire that the land be sold upon the terms and Credit above specified, and the proceeds of such sale divided in manner before mentioned.

1th. It is my will and desire that my beloved wife Mary Emme shall have her support, either by living with my son Joseph, or if she prefers it, to have that portion of my estate allotted to her, that she thinks proper under the law made and provided for in such Cases. - I My Will &c hereby make and appoint my son Joseph Emme my Executor, of this my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 6th day of April 1846.

In the name of God Amen. I John Leason of the County of Alleghany and State of Virginia being for adorn-
ed in life, full of sound mind and disposing memory and Calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous of disposing of all my personal and Real estate, as it has pleased god to bless me with. I give and bequeath in manner following (Wig to say) Sonid.

First. I devise that all my just debts and general expenses be paid out of any money on hand at the time of my decease or if none, then out of any money arising from the sale of

2ndly. I give and bequeath to my son George Leason all that tract or parcel of land on which he now resides, containing two hundred and fifty one acres & Rods and 8 poles and bounded as follows. To wit. Beginning at 3 white oaks and 2 small poplar corner to James Leason's land, on a line of a survey of 1296 acres. Thence with the latter South 88° 13 1/2 pbs. to 2 Chestnuts and a poplar, on the line of said survey of 1296 acres. Thence leaving said line S. 37. E 90 pbs. Crossing Snake Run to a Sugar Tree and 2 white oaks on the Snake run road. S 7. E 27 pbs. to a white oak and red oak, S 44 1/2 E 3 1/2 pbs. to 3 Chestnut oaks on a ridge. S 82 E 3 1/2 pbs. to 2 Chestnuts, and a white oak, S 68. E 6 1/2 pbs. to 2 Chestnut oaks a ~~white~~ white oak and white. S 42. E 4 1/2 pbs. to 3 Chestnut oaks, on south west side of said Ridge, S 68. E 12 pbs. to 2 Chestnut oaks and red oak on the top of said Ridge. S 43. E 4 1/2 pbs. to a Chestnut and 2 hickory Saplings on the old line, on the top of the mountain. Thence with the latter N 60 E 6 pbs. to a Chestnut and two white oaks, corner to same, and with the same N 65. E 88 pbs. to 2 Chestnut oaks and Chestnut on the line of said survey of 1296 acres, and corner to James Leason's land.
