I Sampson Harnes of the County of Alleghany, State of Virginia being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner and form by, To Wit: I Will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Clarissa Harnes, all my real estate, Lands and Immovables, during her natural life. 2^d I Will and bequeath to my said wife, all my personal property and negroes, to be disposed of by her, during her life, as at her death, as she may deem proper. 3^d I Will and bequeath to my two Sons, John & James George W. Harnes all my real estate, Lands and Immovables, to be equally divided between them, at the death of my wife. 4th I Will and direct that should either of my two Sons die leaving no lawful Children, the Survivors one shall all my real estate, Lands and Immovables. 5th I Will and bequeath to my three Daughters, Margaret & Harnes Rebecca Harnes and Maria Harnes a good Horse, Saddle and Bridle to be given to them by my said wife or Sons from the proceeds of the Land or farm when they marry, or when my said wife or Sons shall deem most reasonable. 6th I Will and direct that my three Daughters, Margaret, Rebecca and Susan, in my House and farm my Harnes and that my two Daughters Rebecca and Maria be educated, during the proceeds of the farm, free of Charge to them. 7th I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Amanda Harnes, two Linens & Cattle, two dollars in money, to be paid to her by my Executors at her entire, entire and full portion of my estate, real and personal, moved. 8th I Will and direct that should my two Sons either of them survive with their Mother, upon the farm, until they reach the age of twenty one years, that they have for their later and education such Compensation as their said Mother shall deem reasonable and right. 9th I Will and direct that my Executors, so soon as may be, pay all my just debts of whatsoever description. 10th and lastly, I appoint my beloved wife Clarissa Harnes, my lawful and Sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. Signed, sealed approved and acknowledged by me, this 1st day of January A. D. 1834
