I, William S. Kincaid of the County of Alleghany and State
of Virginia, being of sound Mind and Memory, best know that
Death is the appointed lot of all Men, and feel in some
degree the decline of my health: do make and ordain
this as my last will and testament, in manner & form
as follows To wit: In the first place, I bequeath my
soul to God, and my body to be decently buried.
I will my daughter Maria S. Kincaid a good horse
saddle and bridle not worth less than seventy five
dollars, which she is to have at the age eighteen
years old. And I will my Son Andrew B. Kincaid
a horse saddle and bridle not worth less than seventy
five dollars which he is to have at the age of eighteen
years old. I will my daughter Virginia S. Kincaid a horse
saddle and bridle not worth less than seventy five dollars.
I will my daughter Patsy A. S. Kincaid a horse saddle
and bridle not worth less than seventy five dollars.
Virginia S. Kincaid and Patsy A. S. Kincaid to have their
horses saddles and bridles at the age of eighteen years old
I will my black girl Nelly to be hired out during my lifetime
till my death and the profits of the hire.
I will my black girl Nelly to be hired out during my lifetime
she is to receive the profits of the hire. I will my black
girl Nelly to be hired out during my lifetime and the profits
of the hire to go to my Mother during her life. My black
girl Lucy is to be hired out for ten years and the profits
of the hire to be equally divided between all four of my
children and at the expiration of the time to be sold and
the money to be equally divided between all the children.
My black boy William is to be hired out and the profits
of the hire to be applied to the benefit of my Son Andrew
Kincaid, for the term of twelve years, and at the
end of twelve years he is to be sold and the price
to be equally divided between all four of my
children. — I will each of my children a good
Bread and clothing. All my Bonds Notes and accounts
are to be collected and equally divided between
my four children in clothing and schooling.
All the balance of my personal property to be
sold and divided between my four children
equally. I will that my Brother John S. Kincaid

shall have as much of my estate as will buy him a
House. I will my Son Andrew Kincaid the tract of land
which I own adjoining the Lands of ~~James T. Mann~~
Lewis T. Mann, of eighty five Acres. I will my part of
a Survey of two hundred and three Acres on Clavis
Mountain to John S. Kincaid. I will that my share
of my Father's real estate shall be sold and
equally divided between all my children.
I will that my black girl Nelly and her
child shall be free Nelly to be free at the
death of my Mother and her child to be
free when my daughter Mary arrives at the
age of twenty one years. And I do appoint
my Brother John S. Kincaid as my Executor.

1st. I hereby assume - as my own debts, those debts of my Son Thomas, for the payment of which I am Security, and I hereby authorize my Executor to pay said debts with the first money he may receive from my Estate.

2nd I give to my Sons Thomas and Arnold one hundred dollars each.

3rd I give to my Son John's Children one hundred dollars.

4th. I give to my Son William's Children one hundred dollars.

5th. I give to my daughters Peggy & Hannah one hundred dollars each.

6th. If after the payment of the above legacies any money of my Estate may be remaining, I wish said remaining money to be divided into seven equal parts, of which I give one part to my Son Thomas, one to my Son Arnold, one to my daughter Peggy, one to my daughter Hannah, one to my daughter Eliza, one to my Son William's Children and the remaining seventh part to my Son John's Children.

7th. I hereby appoint my Son Thomas my Sole Executor to this my last will, & I hereby authorize him to sell (and convey a full and legal title and right) the tract of land on which he now resides.
