paid out of the residue of my estate, after which if any thing
remains, I hereby bequeath the same to George S. Williams &
said Martha Armentrout, to be equally divided between
them - Item 5th - I hereby Constitute & appoint my sons
said & George S. Armentrout executors of this my last will &
Testament, who is as my desire shall not be required by the
Court to give security, in testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal.

which he has executed for the said sixty acres of land. I direct that in
five acres of land where my Grand son William Shumaker Jr resides he
sell & the money for the same is equally divided amongst all my heirs
I also direct that in my will that my daughter Beulah has twenty five
dollars out of the said where my son John A. & Shumaker now resides
my Grand son Charles Shumaker to have twenty five dollars out of the
same lands & that my son Thomas may either pay the above amount to
said Beulah & Charles Shumaker & keep the land otherwise he may sell
said land or a portion & receive the money for the same. I further direct
that my son Thomas have my household & kitchen furniture one to
him & half one to his son George & George's wife. I further direct that
after my death that all my debts are paid the balance in money
be collected & is divided equally amongst my surviving heirs.

I further direct that my son John A. Shumaker pay to my son Thomas
to pay thirty dollars out of the land he now occupies as
long as he remains in it I declare the above to be my last will & Testament
