1st. After my just debts and funeral expenses shall be fully paid, I Will and bequeath to my Grand Son, John H. Miller, Son of my Son Henry Miller, by his first Wife all my real and personal Estate, (that is to say, as to my Curied Estate) he the said John H. Miller is not to sell for seven years after my death, and then provided he should have any lawful heirs or heirs, it to remain to during his natural life time, and to descend to his lawful heirs or heirs.

2^d. I hereby appoint Nathaniel McKimney Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Testimony whereof, I have set my hand and seal affixed my seal, this 11th day of March 1832
